COVID-19 testing

If you need a COVID-19 test, it's covered — with no out-of-pocket costs. COVID testing is covered both in and out-of-network. However, it's recommended that you remain in-network when possible. We'll also cover the visit where you get the test, whether that's at a doctor's office, urgent care center, or emergency room. - CVS Pharmacies Please use the website to ensure the location near you is participating.
- Doctor's offices You should contact your doctor prior.



Antibody / Serology testing

If you need an Antibody test (also referred to you as a serology test), it's covered — with no out-of-pocket costs. Antibody testing is covered both in and out-of-network. However, it's recommended that you remain in-network, when possible. We'll also cover the visit where you get the test, whether that's at a doctor's office, urgent care center, or emergency room. Most locations that offer COVID-19 testing will also offer antibody testing. Please note that there are many tests out in the marketplace, and to ensure that the test will be covered, please speak with your doctor first. Members are able to walk into any CITY MD location without an appointment and get this test without a prescription from your doctor. All other tests will require a prescription from your doctor.

- Participating Urgent Care Centers.
- Doctor's offices You should contact your doctor prior.
- Lab sites. You must have a prescription from your doctor if going to a lab site.
